***Debra Osborne was chosen as the 2021-2022 District-wide Teacher of the Year.**
 - Gray Beach was named 2021 STAR Student. To obtain the STAR nomination high school students must have the highest score on any single test date of the SAT, taken through the March test date of their senior year, and be in the top 10 percent or top 10 students of their class, based on grade point average. Gray chose former teacher, Ms. Liza Morgan, as his STAR Teacher.
 - Future Problem Solvers:
Summerville Middle School- Lileah Braden, Caiden Carter, Jackson Cromer, and Kaylee Newsome placed 3rd, overall, in Global Issues Problem Solving. In 2nd Place for Team Action Plan were Brock Cooper, John Roan, and Nyala Thurman. Placing 2nd in presentation of their action plan were Lileah Braden, Caiden Carter, Brock Cooper, Jackson Cromer, and John Roan. In individual competition, Rafael Lopez placed 2nd in

the Middle Division of Global Issues Problem Solving. Rafael advanced to the International FPS competition in June.

Chattooga High School- Sarah Beth Hampton earned 1st Place in the Future Problem Solving Program State Bowl. Her topic was Personalized Medicine. She also had the highest-ranking Action Plan in her division and advanced to the International Conference in June. This was Sarah's fifth year competing in the Future Problem Solving Program and her fourth opportunity to compete at the international level.

Menlo Elementary School- Pippa Key won 1st Place in Global Issues Problem Solving, Middle Division and 1st Place in Individual Action Plan Global Issues Problem Solving, Middle Division. Mrs. Amanda Williams is the FPS coordinator for MES.

Lyerly Elementary School- Carter Montgomery placed 1st in Scenario Writing and competed in the International Conference in June. In the Global Issues Problem Solving Team Competition, Victoria Ward, Brayden Barrett, Katie Dillard, and Carter Montgomery place 1st and competed in the International Conference in June. Madelyn Eager, Cameryn Smith, Addie Veatch and Kendal Zuniga placed 2nd in the same category. - Chattooga High School Volleyball Team made it to the first round of the State Playoffs.
- Chattooga High School Boys' Basketball Team was regular season Region 7AA champs and advanced to the State Playoffs. Their coach, Mr. Jared Groce, reached his 150th win. His overall record of 150-39, makes him the all-time winningest boys' basketball coach in Chattooga High School history.
- Chattooga High School Girls' Basketball Team ended up in 3rd Place in regular season, Region 7AA and advanced to the State Playoffs, where they made it to the "Sweet Sixteen" game. Their head coach is Mr. Alvah Beasley.
- The Chattooga High School Track Team, coached by Renee Beasley, had a great season, and fared very well at the State Track Meet. Sada Williamson placed 5th in 100 Hurdles, Caroline Hodges placed 4th in State (2A) for Discus, Cash Allen came in 2nd in Long Jump, Nick Hester placed 4th in Triple Jump and Devon Heroch took 2nd Place in Discus.
- Another amazing year for Head Coach, Brian Beasley and the Chattooga High School Wrestling Team!

Senior, Ty Veatch- AA State Champion @220, three-time State Finalist with a record of 20-0 for the 2021-21 season.

Junior, Rowan Burdick- AA State Runner-up @160 and three-time State Placer.

Freshman, Kendra Heroch- Girls State Runner-up @142. Kendra was the first girl to place at a state tournament, in Chattooga history.

- A great season for Chattooga High School Boys' and Girls' Tennis Teams. The Boys finish 3rd in Region and the Girls placed 4th which advanced both teams to the State Playoffs. This was the first time in Chattooga High School history that both the Boys and Girls made it to the State Playoffs in the same year. They were coached by Mrs. Stephanie Ratliff.

CHS also sent two of the top eight teams in the state, to the State Leadership Skills Conference in March. Team #1, Welding Fabrication Team, which consisted of William Elrod, Gavin Jarrett, Marrion Mosteller and Rett Rosson, won 1st Place. Team #2, (Construction) Teamworks, which consisted of Brittonie Cordle, Brody Mobbs, Caden Smith, Landon Stephens and Issac Ratledge, also won 1st Place. Jackson Eckroat, Sage

Owings, and Tristen Price all won 2nd Place in their divisions, and Jesse Weeks placed 3rd. In addition, Sage Owings went on to win the Tulsa Welding School's National Welding Competition, receiving a full scholarship to TWS.
